ATLANTIA AGREES INSURANCE POLICY PROVIDING PROTECTION AND FOR GROUP'S 13,500 EMPLOYEES IN ITALY IN

HOSPITALISATION WITH COVID-19

Rome, Saturday, 21 March 2020 - With the intention of protecting the health of the Group's 13,500 employees in Italy, Atlantia announces that it has extended the coverage provided by its Medical Insurance Package to include a series of health and social care services in the case of hospitalisation due to the corona virus. The policy covers workers (and other insured family members) employed by the holding company and its Italian subsidiaries, such as Autostrade per

l'Italia, Aeroporti di Roma, Telepass, Pavimental and Spea, as well as the employees of other

Group companies, such as Infoblu, AutostradeTECH, AD Moving, Essediesse, SAM, TANA,

SAT, SITMB, RAV and TPay.

The policy covers care and assistance for employees and insured family members during

treatment for Covid-19, supporting them throughout the process of returning to full health.

Key aspects of the cover include payment of a sum for each day spent in hospital, in addition to

any expenses incurred before and after the hospital stay.

As an example, the policy covers reimbursement of the cost of transporting the patient and a

companion from their home to hospital and back again (in an ambulance or by public transport,

including by taxi). Cover also extends to board and lodging, including any hotel-type expenses.

The policy also pays a daily sum should it be necessary to self-isolate at home after having tested positive for the virus.

All employees will have access to a dedicated remote medical service for Covid-19, offering the chance to speak to a team of doctors available 24/7 to answer calls. Other services designed to help families cope with the medical emergency will also be included.

The Group's employees will be informed of the measures designed to help people with Covid-19 in the coming days.
